MILESTONES

FYE March 2017

- First reptile repatriation of Rahayu, the trafficked Malaysian giant turtle back to the protected wild in Malaysia.
- Investigations prove the need for improvement of animal welfare standards in bird shops in Singapore.
- Launch of "Our Wild Neighbours" to promote human-wildlife coexistence.
- First ever case of two macaques in conflict prevented from euthanasia, through rehabilitation and release into the wild.
- Opening of avian rehabilitation facility.

FYE March 2018

- Six reptiles smuggled into Singapore repatriated back to the wild in Malaysia.
- First joint operation to resolve a macaque conflict that derived from public feeding via education, rescue, rehabilitation and release.
- Brand new treatment facility for sick and injured wildlife with improved diagnostic features.
- A new sanctuary for smuggled exotic wildlife.

FYE March 2019

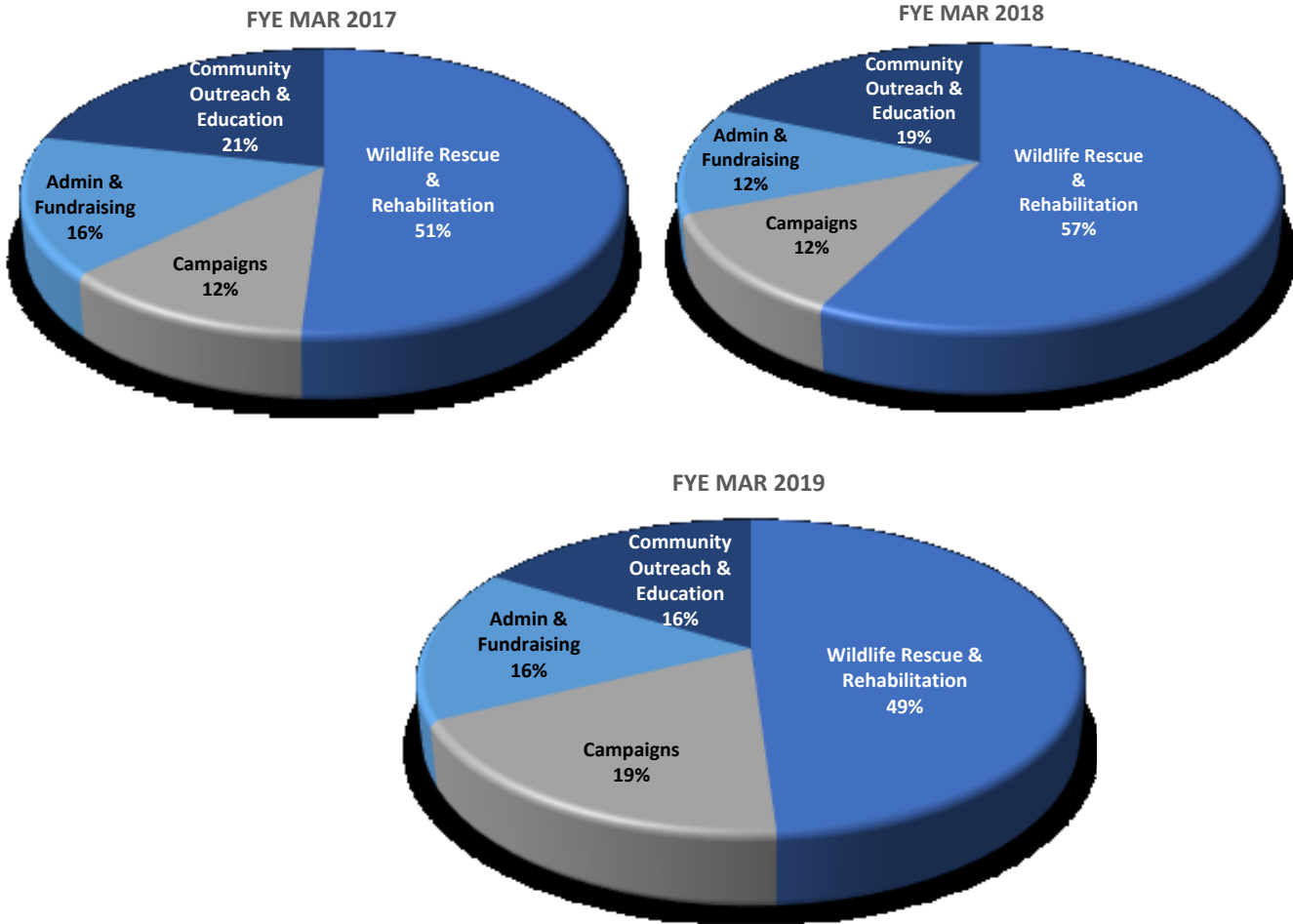
- Largest ever repatriation of 51 trafficked endangered Indian star tortoises back to the wild in India.
- Roundtable on online trade in prohibited wildlife.
- First ever joint monkey guards programme in Thomson estate.
- Become an active member of the Wild Animals and Birds Act Review Legislative Committee.
- Launch of the Community Wildlife Rescue Team empowering more individuals to assist distressed wildlife.
